Speakers

Mr. Gary Nordeen

Gary Nordeen is a Senior Building Science Specialist with extensive knowledge relating to building, energy, and ventilation codes. He has worked with a variety of state and utility energy conservation programs for over 20 years. Currently, Gary is the technical lead for the US Department of Energy Building Technologies Information Center, provides code training for building department staff, designers, builders, and the general public, assists with code development for the Washington State Building Code Council, and provides technical assistance to local jurisdictions and the general public.

Mr. James Mallory

James Mallory is the president of Environix, Inc. Washington's premier mold and indoor environmental consulting firm. Prior to his position at Environix, he co-founded MICRO, the nation's largest mold inspection and remediation training organization, training thousands of inspectors and contractors. Locally, he has worked as both technical training director and on-site inspector for nearly 10 years, working with many high profile clients such as the US Coast Guard, Royal Canadian Navy, and University of Puget Sound. During this time James also pioneered many new residential inspection and remediation techniques which have become industry standards.

Mr. Curtis Dahl

Curtis Dahl has been in the solar industry since 1976 and the HVAC industry since 1985. He has been certified through NATE (North American Technician Excellence) and NFI (National Fireplace Institute). Curtis is a Washington State 01 Electrical Administrator and a Washington State 02 Electrician. He is also a member of Seattle Executives, is the President of the Washington State Chapter of the ACCA (Air Conditioning Contractors of America), and currently sits on the contractors advisory board of Puget Sound Energy. Curtis has worked for **SUNDANCE** Energy Services, Inc. since 1981 and has been one of the principles since 1994.

Mr. Larry Stamp

Larry Stamp is a former general contractor and volunteer firefighter in Washington State, was trained and certified at ITA, Oceanside, California in 1999 and has been performing inspections full time since 2000, approaching 5000 inspections to date. Larry has served on several training committees, most notably The ASHI School for Washington State, Kaplan ITA, Renton WA and the WSU Structural Pest Inspector Training Facility in Puyallup WA. He is also the statewide Education Chair for the WSPMA, (Washington State Pest Management Association), and an instructor for the WSDA, (Washington State Department of Agriculture). Larry is a certified FEMA inspector, and a Certified Mobile Home Inspector, as well as a Certified Washington State Real Estate Instructor, and has served as past president of WAPI, Washington Association of Property Inspectors, and past national president of All (American Inspectors Institute). Larry is a licensed WA State Home Inspector (#222), a WSDA Licensed Structural Pest Inspector (#59753), and holds current membership in ASHI, All, WAPI, and WSPMA.

Mr. Douglas Hanson

Douglas Hansen is the principal author of the Code Check series of field guides to building codes, with over 1 million copies in print, and the author of Electrical Inspection of Existing Dwellings. Douglas sits on the technical committee for Electrical Systems Maintenance of the National Fire Protection Association. The committee is responsible for NFPA 73 – The Standard for Electrical Inspection of Existing Dwellings. For several years, he taught residential and commercial electrical codes at the College of San Mateo. He provides seminars around the country to inspectors, building departments, and electricians on building and electrical codes, construction defects, and inspection techniques.

He has authored dozens of magazine articles and over 20 books. He holds a general contractor's license and several ICC inspection certifications. He has served as an expert witness in over 150 cases involving contractor and inspector standard of care, building codes, construction defects, and disclosure issues, and has testified in Superior Courts in several counties.

He is a member of the Western Construction Consultants Association, ASHRAE, ICC, NFPA, IAEI, & ASHI. In 2010 he became a director of the Building Standards Institute, publisher of the California Building Performance Guidelines. He currently chairs the California Residential Code committee of the Redwood Empire Association of Code Officials, and the Code Clearing Committee of the NorCal chapter of IAEI. He is a recipient of the CREIA John Daly and Bob Reeds awards, and the ASHI Phil Monahan and John Cox awards.
